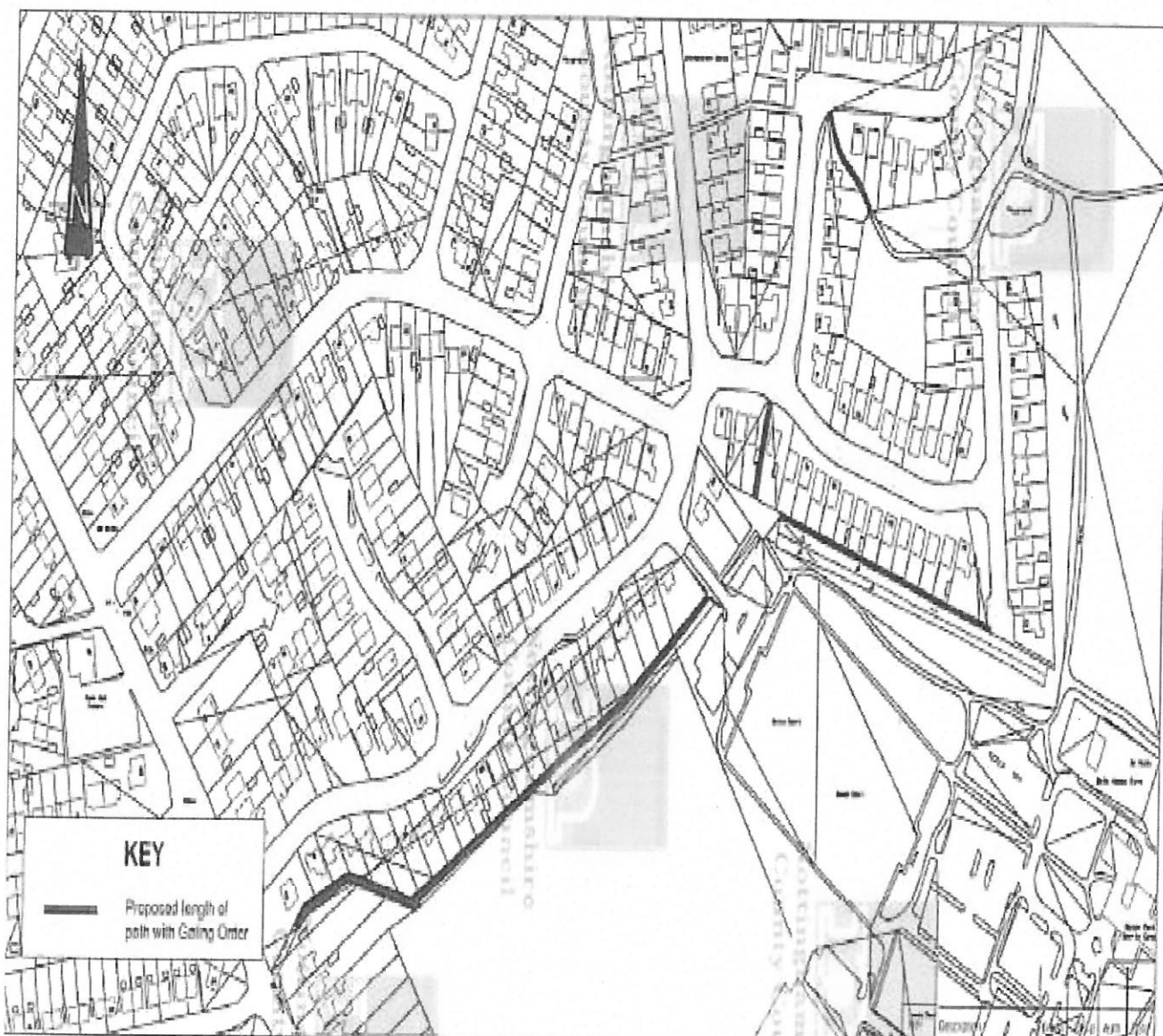

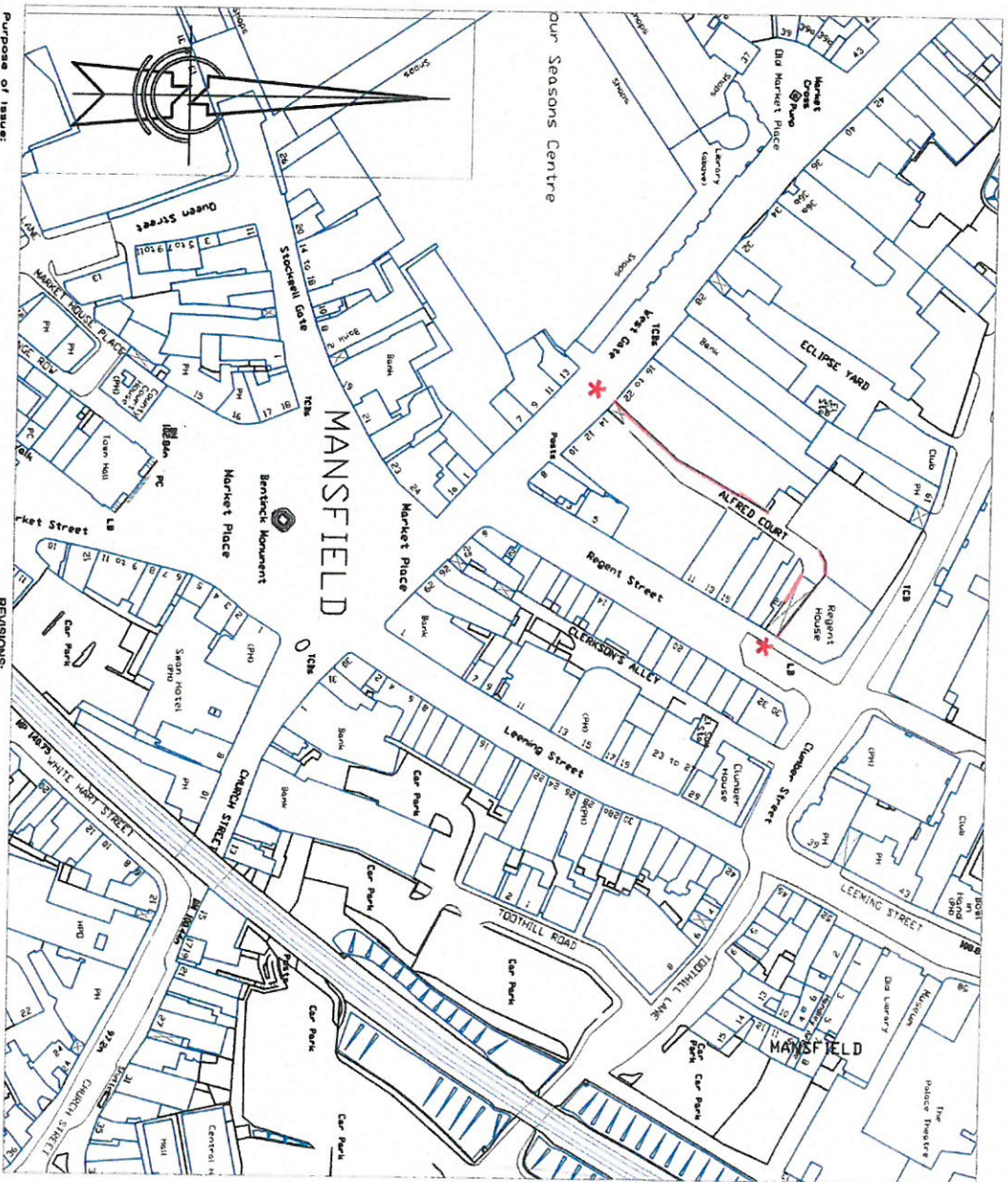

##### **Victim Support and Witness Service**

The Victim Support scheme operates from a number of locations within Nottinghamshire and their volunteers are specially trained to provide free and confidential information, support and advice.

All victims and witnesses required to give evidence at Court will be offered support from Victim Support's court based Witness Service, which is independent, confidential and free. This support will include someone to talk to, a quiet place in which to wait and a chance to see the courtroom before the day of the trial so you know what to expect.
