<p>Reasons for decision</p> <p>Mansfield District Council has been awarded £310,273 from the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG)</p> <p>The funding is ring fenced for homeless prevention and will be used to prioritise prevention activity and to carry out homelessness activities in line with the principles of the Homelessness Reduction Act.</p> <p>This grant is designed to support the delivery of services to tackle homelessness across the country. The funding that has been provided is to help reduce homelessness in our area and allow us the flexibility to provide local services to the needs of the district.</p>
